

World Peace Walker Returns To Tampa

Audri Scott Williams is the first African-Native American woman to lead a global peace walk and has recently begun a national peace walk. The walk convened in Atlanta, GA on 10/10/10 with plans to circle the country until 11/11/11. Audri's current project is called the "13 Moon Walk 4 Peace" based on the 13 moons within the year they will be traveling. A diverse group of 13 walkers ranging in age from 3 to 82, have been inspired to join Audri in her vision of PEACE (Passionately Engaged Affecting Community Everywhere). The goal is to awaken the heart of America, bringing visibility to the invisible and voice to the voiceless to affect healing and transformation in the way we relate to each other and to Mother Earth. The peace walkers will be visiting over 40 cities with their message of peace and social justice. They will be carrying the "Sacred Flame Of Thunder" representing The Great Law Of Peace passed on from the Iroquois Six Nations in Canada.

Audri will be interviewed by Tampa radio station WMNF (88.5 FM) and Tampa University station WUTT (1080 AM). Audri is an alumni of Tampa University class of 1975 and was honored with the "Outstanding Female Graduate" of her class award. She and her group of walkers will begin their Tampa presentation with a "Walk A Mile For Peace" event on Saturday November 6th, beginning at the intersection of Bay Shore Blvd and South Howard Street at 1:00 pm walking to Plant Park at Tampa University. The public is encouraged to attend and participate in the walk and activities at the park. On Sunday November 7th at Unity Church in Tampa, Audri will be a guest speaker of Reverend Alan Moss and the Unity congregation. Later Sunday at 4 pm the peace team will conduct a healing water ceremony on the bay. The peace walkers will also be offering a free public screening of the film, "For The Next Seven Generations" (13 Indigenous Grandmothers share their vision for healing our planet) at Tampa University at 7pm on Monday, November 8th. The "13 Moon Walk 4 Peace" is honored to announce a new alliance with WorldBed, Inc. beginning in Tampa. A non-profit organization dedicated to providing comfortable bedding to victims of catastrophes and poverty. The group will be serving at a local food bank, will be visiting a sacred land site and touring the Green-Florida urban gardens, on the corner of Newton ave and Highland St. South on Friday November 5th at 4 pm, as part of their activities while in the city. The project is being sponsored in part by The Spirit Of Truth Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, and encourages local individuals, groups and organizations to participate by donating financially, becoming a community host/volunteer, and to "Walk A Mile For Peace."
